

**Traffic Committee Meeting Minutes**  
**Wednesday, September 19, 2007**

**Old Business**

- The August 15, 2007 minutes were approved as written.

**Updates**

- Sharon prepared the letters to the Tenney Street businesses regarding the new truck regulations. They will be mailed 9/20.
- The Selectmen will review the Committee's recommendations regarding Clark Street on September 24, during their regularly scheduled Board of Selectmen's meeting.

**New Business**

- Peter reported that several roads in Georgetown are not accepted by the State. Roads that are accepted by the State are included in the formula for Chapter 90 funds. Peter will research how to petition for road acceptance and will report back to the Committee at the next meeting. The consensus of the Committee is that we should petition to have all roads accepted by the State; Committee members offered to assist as needed.
- Peter spoke with the homeowner at the corner of Cottage and Andover Street about the height of the corner fence. The homeowner agreed to change the fence so that it is graduated at a 45 degree angle, allowing improved visibility at the intersection.
- Sgt. DeFeo will research whether there is a bylaw regarding outdoor furniture on sidewalks. If there is, the new owner of the Olde Town Tavern will need to be alerted.
- Sgt. DeFeo reported that there have been complaints about trucks parking on the sidewalk at Scotty's Mobil. He stated that sections of the sidewalk are actually roadway and thus there is no violation. Truck operators have been asked to move their trucks when violations occur.
- The Committee agreed to postpone the discussion about the Traffic Flow around the library until the library is fully operational.
- Sharon invited Richard Paganelli of the Georgetown Recreation Path Committee to present at the October meeting.
