Administrative Business

- 1. Minutes Approval: minutes were not available for approval, postponed to next meeting.
- 2. Kim Therrien has resigned as a committee member.
- 3. Steve Pinto has been submitted to the Con Com to fill the opening as a committee member.

Discussion and Motions:

- 1. Treasurer's Report
 - Balance of the Revolving Account end of FY2021 is \$17,724.
 - Estimated income for 1st 6 months of FY2022 is \$22,800.
 - Estimated income for FY2022 is \$35,785.
 - Friends of CD balance is around \$4,300.
 - Because of changes in town allowable accounting practices, The Friends of CD can no longer pay bills and request reimbursement.

2. New business

- Due to accounting changes (see Treasurer's Report), the current arrangement for cleaning will need be terminated because:
 - i. The individual currently providing the service can't be setup as a vendor or contractor to the town.
 - ii. The other option is to hire as a PT employee of the town, which would increase the cost to the camp by roughly 40%.
 - iii. Cleaning will be managed by the Camp Manager.
- For long term operational stability, it is necessary for us to recruit additional volunteers.
 - i. An especially important role, not being performed is a Social Media manager.
 - ii. Additional volunteers to help maintain the facilities will be required as the current crew of dedicated volunteers continues to age.
 - iii. Numerous strategies were discussed with some specific actions to be taken.

3. Old business

- Upcoming expenses: A review of potential upcoming major expenses to be considered was discussed:
 - i. Lodge electrical service upgrade is moving forward.

- During the time between when the grant request was submitted to the CPC and when it was approved the cost of the work has increased by 30-40% for materials and continues to rise. The shortfall will need to be made up by the camp and Friends organization.
- In addition to materials cost increases there are unanticipated requirements, such as moving the man-door, reorganizing the shop space to accommodate the panel changes and elimination of overhead cables. We need to do the upgrade and want to get started before costs go up further.
- 3. The first week in November has been blocked out for the work on the calendar since the lodge and Nature Center will be without power for 2-3 days, without complications.
- ii. The dump-body ATV (aka "Beast") needs maintenance to ensure continued service.
 - 1. The front tires will be replaced.
 - 2. An estimate for brake and other items to be done by Rosencrantz (John Deere service) will be requested and the cost evaluated before moving forward. This will incur a cost.
- iii. The golf cart needs a new fwd-rev switch and other maintenance.
- iv. The current storage for flammables should be upgraded to bring it up to code.
- v. The floor in the Men's side of the Bath House needs to be repaired over the winter. Temporary repairs for safety to get through the season have been completed.
- 4. Camp Manager's Report
 - Summer Camp is in full swing, despite the continuous rain since the beginning of July.
 - Bookings are strong.
 - Web searches of other venues completed to research competing facilities, advertising, and pricing in the area.
 - The lodge needs to be prepped and painted in several places in preparation for weddings later this year. The rain has prevented progress in July.
