General Manager's Letter



I would like to thank Georgetown Municipal Light Department ratepayers for their patience and kind words during and after the series of violent storms we experienced in March. The storms presented some unprecedented

challenges, some of which we were able to overcome through field expedient switching and restoration work by our line crews. Others were insurmountable due to the total loss of power feeding our two substations located at Moulton Street and Searle Street.

I would also like to thank the Georgetown Fire and Police Departments, and the Department of Public Works. The teamwork between these departments and Georgetown Light helped us all work safely and productively. In addition, I would like to thank our colleagues in the Middleton and Groveland light departments who responded and greatly reduced outage times.

The Georgetown Municipal Light Department office staff was key in giving real time updates to those affected by area outages and also to the entire town when necessary. Providing the correct information to the ratepayers allowed people to manage their expectations, providing a beneficial impact as we received many positive comments in the days after the storms.

The Georgetown Municipal Light Department expends a great deal of resources on preventive maintenance. We understand that the time to fight the storm is not after it has hit. As a result, our non-municipal light plant neighbors incurred far longer outages than we did.

Recently, several area light plant managers and I met with our transmission provider to work on ways to make the lines feeding our substations more reliable. I am confident that we can assist our transmission line provider in making these feeds more reliable over time.

While serious storms are unfortunate and unpredictable, I am confident that Georgetown Municipal Light Department will be ready to respond to whatever Mother Nature brings our way.

Summer energy tips:

- When the summer heat cools off at night, turn off your air conditioner and open your windows while sleeping. When you wake up in the morning, shut the windows and blinds to keep the cool air in.
- Turn off ceiling fans when you leave the room. Fans cool people, not rooms, by creating a wind chill effect.
- Don't place lamps or a TV near your room air-conditioning thermostat. The thermostat senses heat from these appliances which can cause the air conditioner to run longer than necessary.
- Regularly vacuum registers to remove any dust buildup. Ensure that furniture and other objects are not blocking the airflow through your registers.
- On hot days, when outdoor temperatures are higher than the temperature inside your house, close all the windows and exterior doors. You should also install insulated window shades or other window treatments. Close the shades to not only block out direct sunlight but also the radiated heat from the outdoors.
